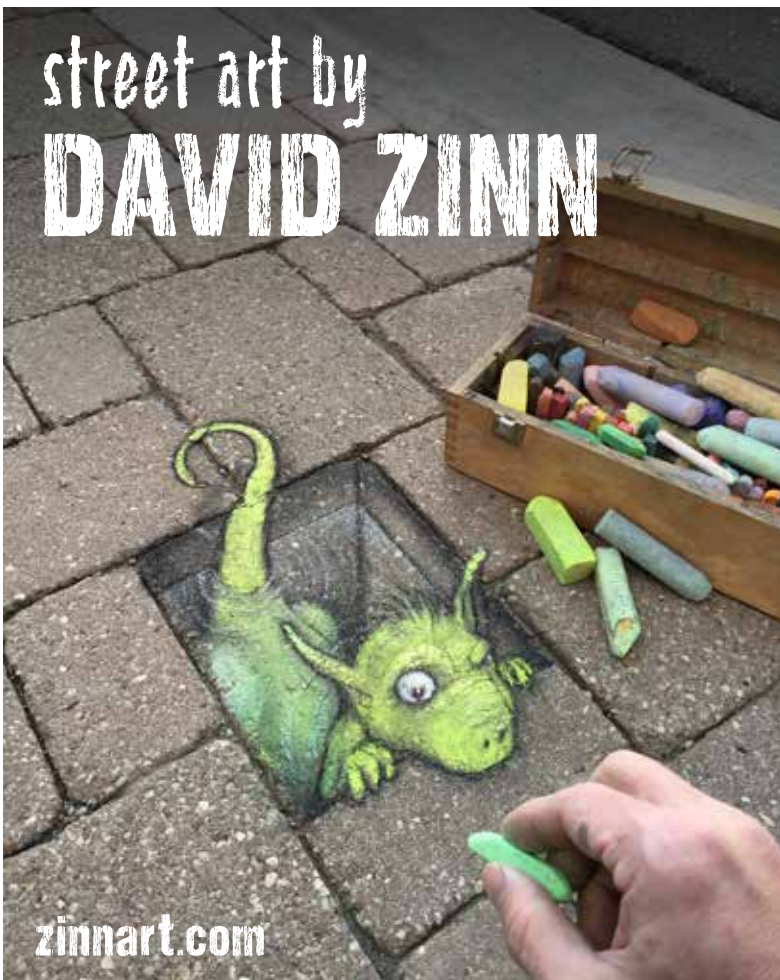


street art by DAVID ZINN



Since 2005, street artist David Zinn has been creating his most celebrated work in a medium that washes away in the rain: his drawings are improvised using chalk, charcoal and found objects, such as cracks in concrete or leaves on the ground. Although the installations themselves are temporary, photos of his light-hearted underfoot creatures are shared every day on Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Reddit and countless blogs and news outlets all over the world, accumulating more than 350,000 followers on social media and resulting in the publication of two popular books, *Temporary Preserves* and *Underfoot Menagerie*.

Mr. Zinn is inspired by a desire to place cheerful art in places where it is not expected and to embrace the temporary nature of all things. Furthermore, by drawing in public with easily obtained "childish" materials, David hopes to demystify both the creation and the appreciation of art, reconnecting people with the joy and confidence with which they themselves created art as children.
